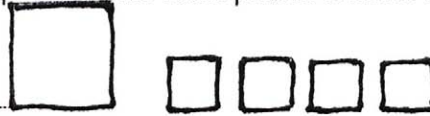


### MYSTERY SCRAPPY SATURDAY SAMPLER BLOCK 6

Mysterious tip: This row of flying geese will be added to the top of your quilt, above the horizontal row of block "1". Flying geese show up better if the fabric pattern is not too large, unless it's large pattern reads as a solid.



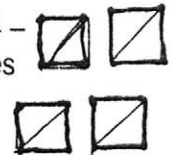
Cutting:

**Cut (6) squares 6 1/4".** They will become the "geese" and can be varied or shaded medium to dark. (One large square makes four geese.)

**Cur (24) 3 3/8" squares.** They will become the tips or background for the geese and need to contrast or be lighter than the geese squares cut above. (Four small squares go with one large square). If you are making all these squares the same, cut (3) 3 3/8" strips first then cut into (24) squares.

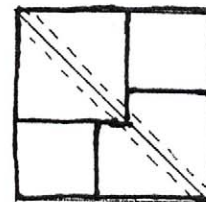
**Suggested Ruler: Flying Geese X 4 "NO MATH" Ruler**

One of my all time favorite rulers for cutting scrappy flying geese is the "FLYING GEESE X 4 - NO MATH RULER". You look for the finished size of your flying geese rectangle and it's lines are marked for cutting where needed, no math! Each goose rectangle in your row needs to finish at 2 1/2" x 5" and uses the cutting measurements above or the H. letter on this ruler.



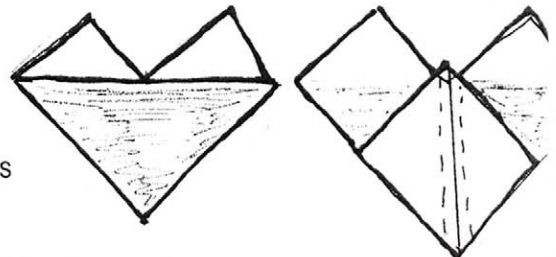
Sewing:

1. Draw a line diagonally across the back of all the little squares.
2. Place two small squares (rst) as pictured on to a large square. Match two sides of each small square with an opposite corner of The large square. The little squares will overlap in the middle.



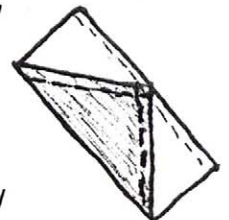
3. Sew 1/4" from both sides of the diagonal line. Cut on the line.

4. Press toward the tips to make two of the pieces shown.



5. Place a small square on each of the remaining large sq. corners as shown. Sew 1/4" from the drawn line and cut on it.

6. This will make four units measuring 3"x 5 1/2". If doing scrappy I like to plan the geese row above my quilt, then sew the geese together in groups of four, as each four geese needs to measure 10 1/2" long to match blocks below. As pictured sew geese blocks with centered point piece on top stitching just outside point to create a perfect triangle.



If you are making a twin sized quilt add another row of block (3), the checkerboard followed by a row of block (1).

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
